Called To Leadership

JOHN & KAREN SWEDBERG

John Swedberg ('64 OBBC) knew he wanted to be a missionary to Brazil since the fourth grade. For the last 50 years, he and his wife Karen (Leggott '67) have been fulfilling that call to serve as missionaries to Brazil with Baptist Mid-Missions.

"While in Indiana, our family was part of the founding of the Winona Lake Baptist Church (now Fellowship Baptist Church in Warsaw)," said John. "We were missions-minded and had missionaries present their ministries to the church. One of these missionaries, Robert Collins, stayed with our family for a week. I was in the fourth grade and learning to play the trumpet. Uncle Bob played the trumpet and told how he used it to gather crowds in the villages

A lifetime of missionary service to Brazil along the Amazon River. At the end of his week in our house, I told him that when I grew up, I was going to be a missionary in Brazil with him. Uncle Bob was one of the speakers at the Missions Conference my freshman year, and that confirmed in my mind God's call into missions."

John met Karen at her church in Lexington, Nebraska, after John's father became the pastor there.

"It was in Lexington where I met Karen, who was a member of the church," said John. "We dated some during my junior year, then she graduated and went to Omaha Baptist Bible College (OBBC). After graduation from high school, I chose OBBC to get my Bible training for the ministry. It was closer to home than other fundamental Baptist schools, so it was an easy choice."

They were married after Karen's sophomore year (John's freshman year) of college at OBBC. Her desire to go into missions was also confirmed during missions conferences at OBBC. Karen considers her education at Faith a cornerstone of her ministry.

John appreciates the lifelong friendships he was able to make (some of which have supported their ministry for more than 50 years), and the training he received in doctrine and Christian education.

The Swedbergs are currently in a church planting ministry in São José do Rio Preto, Brazil, working with their youngest son, Daniel. John also works as a member of the board of directors of the Editora Batista Regular do Brasil.

While John notes that there are no barriers to sharing the gospel, their lifelong commitment of missionary service to a country that is predominately Catholic has not always been easy.

"When we joined the mission, Dr. Patten, President of OBBC at the time, told us after we were accepted by the BMM council, 'to never doubt in the dark, what He has revealed in the light,'" said Karen. "I have learned that He is faithful and sovereign. He is always in control. I don't need to fret, but it is hard to always practice that."

The Swedbergs have three sons, three daughters-in-law, five grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. Three generations of Swedbergs have attended Faith.

In September, Karen led the fifth annual Pastors Wives Retreat, while also ministering as a Sunday School teacher, and VBS worker. John currently serves as co-pastor of the church and does counseling of younger pastors as needed.

"Though Baptist Mid-Missions has placed us in the emeritus status, we plan to continue to serve until the Lord returns or we are unable to do so physically or mentally," concluded John.



Called To Leadership

President & Founder of The Timothy Group

PAT & JANE MCLAUGHLIN



Pat ('75) and Jane (Power '76) McLaughlin have literally taken the "Word to the World" through their efforts with The Timothy Group in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The Timothy Group is a stewardship campaign and financial development organization that works with Christian colleges, universities, seminaries, K-12 schools, churches, non-profits, camps, and rescue missions all around the world.

"In 1990, having moved to Grand Rapids, Jane and I started our company, The Timothy Group," said Pat. "I was intrigued by my study of Paul the Apostle and his disciple in Ephesus named Timothy. We have been honored to serve around the world in New Zealand, China, The Middle East, Europe,

The United Kingdom, Cuba, Honduras, Canada, and the United States. Over four million air miles later, we have served 1,754 organizations and helped raise over \$2 billion for and with our clients. Faith Baptist Bible College and Theological Seminary helped me establish a sound understanding of biblical principles, and the Bible has a lot to say about stewardship. A challenge we are always addressing with our clients is the belief that God cannot meet their financial needs. \$427 billion was given philanthropically in America last year. God is not having a cash flow problem."

Pat chose Faith Baptist Bible College after four members of the Faith Chorale stayed in his home in Wichita, Kansas, in the spring of 1970. He enjoyed the professors, classes, chapel, and dorm life. He lettered in cross country and was the MCCC champion in 1972, while also lettering in basketball and tennis. Pat played two seasons on Faith's first soccer teams in 1973 and 1974.

Pat and Jane met as teenagers at a GARBC camp, and Jane turned down a scholarship at Kansas State University to attend Faith. They served four years with Ezell Wiggins at True Bible Baptist Church. They were married in June of 1974 and spent that summer in the United Kingdom as Missionary Apprenticeship Program students with Baptist Mid-Missions.

"After graduation, Jane and I accepted a youth pastor position at Bethel Baptist Church in Harlan, Iowa, where we served from 1975 to 1977," said Pat. "I was able to apply my pre-seminary studies at FBBC to lots of opportunities to teach, preach, lead a choir, counsel, and build a successful youth ministry. I learned firsthand how a church body functions and grows. I began M.Div. studies at Denver Baptist Theological Seminary in the fall of 1977. Jane took Hebrew 101 to help drag me up to a passing grade. I graduated in 1981, and Jane delivered our first son Seth during finals week. Matt would come along in 1984."

Pat and Jane's time in seminary was life-changing. Not only was their first child born, but God's plans for the rest of their lives began to take shape there as well.

"In my final semester of seminary, I was asked if I would ever consider the ministry of stewardship as a place that we might serve," said Pat. "In the fall of 1981, I joined a consulting agency, moved to Portland, Oregon, and began to assist churches and other Christian organizations in their annual capital and endowment funding needs. My consults those first nine years took me all over America and back to Denver for a college merger. The result is Colorado Christian University."

The McLaughlins are members of Kentwood Community Church and have used their Faith education in a variety of positions (elder, teacher, youth volunteer, and mentor) since 1986. They have two children, Seth and Matt; two wonderful daughters-in-law, Renee and Kristen; and four grandchildren ages 2 to 9. Seth and Renee and their two boys are in the process of resettling in West Michigan after serving as missionaries for five years in La Ceiba, Honduras. Matt is an executive with Priority Health in West Michigan and is actively involved with Kristen and their two children in their local church.

RON & CYNTHIA HAAS VICE PRESIDENT OF THE TIMOTHY GROUP

The Timothy Group (a stewardship campaign and financial development organization based in Grand Rapids, Michigan) has a motto that states, "The joy of the Lord is literally on our faces when we roll up our sleeves to serve you."

Rolling up their sleeves and serving others is something that Ron ('82, '84) and Cynthia Haas ('83) have done for four decades as a pastor, the Vice President for Institutional Advancement at Faith Baptist Bible College and Theological Seminary, the education director of the Salt & Light Foundation, and as a fundraising consultant to Christian organizations with The Timothy Group.

"I responded to God's call to serve him as a junior high camper at the Iowa Regular Baptist Camp," said Ron. "The Lord led me to Faith where I witnessed genuine servants like Dr. Robert Domokos, Dr. Dave Warren, Mr. Don Anderson, and many others. At Philadelphia Biblical University (now Carin University), I pursued a Master of Organizational Leadership, and was introduced to 'servant leadership theory,' but I learned the basic principles at Faith many vears earlier."

Ron and Cynthia met when she visited his home church while attending Simpson College in Indianola, Iowa. After graduation, Cynthia enrolled at Faith and completed her B.S. in Bible and Theology ('83). Together, they served at First Baptist Church in Farmington, Iowa, and Bethel Baptist

Church in Oskaloosa, Iowa. The Lord then led them back to Faith where Ron served in the administration, and Cynthia taught as an adjunct music instructor.

"God used my time serving at Faith to prepare me for my work today," said Ron. "In addition to all the practical experience I gained, I met Pat McLaughlin, of The Timothy Group, who became my fundraising mentor and eventually my business partner. I love serving many different Christian ministries to help advance the Kingdom."

Ron is the author of Ask for a Fish: Bold, Faith-Based Fundraising and Simply Share: Bold, Grace-Based Giving.

Cynthia has expressed her servant leadership as a music instructor, professional accompanist, and now as a worship coordinator at a Grand Rapids church. Ron and Cynthia instilled servanthood in the lives of their three boys. Stuart served in the U.S. Marine Corps and is a software developer living in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Ethan actively serves in his local church and designs menswear for Original Penguin in New York City, and Jared is serving as a middle school pastor at Island Evangelical Community Church in Hong Kong.

"I appreciate how Faith grounded me in my Biblical understanding to prepare me for life and ministry. I pray that Faith will produce many more servant leaders ready to serve the Lord wherever He leads them."

JANUARY 28-31, 2020


