Mr. Bostic has long been an influential member of the Charleston community. He served as a two term County Councilman, a frequent radio broadcast feature, and sponsor of numerous community organizations and events.

In 2005, Mr. Bostic and his wife, Jenny, founded "Remember," an international humanitarian aid organization that currently assists widows and orphans suffering religious persecution in six underserved countries. He frequently travels around the world in furtherance of this effort and serves on other non-profit boards and as elder at his church.

Mr. Bostic is a former U.S. Marine. He earned a Meritorious Mast for his actions during the ground campaign of Operation Desert Storm. More recent travels through the Middle East and Israel have encouraged Curtis' love of studying and teaching the Bible in its historical, cultural, and geographical context. He now leads private tours of Israel; often taking his groups on the "road less traveled" in order to make the Bible come alive in impactful ways.

The Bostics live on their family farm in Ravenel, South Carolina, where they raise Wagyu cattle. They have five grown children and regularly enjoy motorcycles, flying, serving in their local church, and the company of family and good friends.
