2016 Student Right to Know Data Sheet

- 1) This data (cohort) is based upon the Fall Semester of 2016. It only includes first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students who graduated within 150% of normal time. This totals 63 students (25 male and 38 female). This summary was completed at the end of the appointed 6 years.
- 2) Of the above group of 63 students, 3 (3 male, 0 female) enrolled in the Biblical Worldview Certificate. Of the 3, 0 (0 male, 0 female) graduated with the Biblical Worldview Certificate, and 2 (2 male, 0 female) graduated with an Associate of Arts degree within 150% of normal time with a graduation rate of 66.7%.
 - 2) Of the above group of 63 students, 22 (9 male, 13 female) enrolled in a Two-Year program. Of the 22, 12 (4 male, 8 female) received an Associate of Arts degree and 1 (0 male, 1 female) received a Bachelor's degree within the 150% of normal time with a graduation rate of 59.1%.
- 3) Of the above group of 63 students, 36 (12 male and 24 female) enrolled in a Four-Year Program. Of the 36, 4 (1 male, 3 female) received an Associate of Arts degree, and 14 (1 male, 13 female) received a Bachelor's degree within 150% of normal time with a graduation rate of 50.0 %.
 - 4) Of the above group of 63 students, 2 (1 male, 1 female) enrolled in the Five-Year Program. Of the 2, 1 (0 male, 1 female) received a Bachelor's degree within 150% of normal time with a graduation rate of 50.0%.
 - 5) Due to the death of one student in this cohort the adjusted cohort number is 62.
 - 6) The combined graduation rate of these 62 students was 54.8% (34 of 62).
- 7) This information was obtained in accordance with the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System's (IPEDS) Graduation Rate Survey (GRS).
