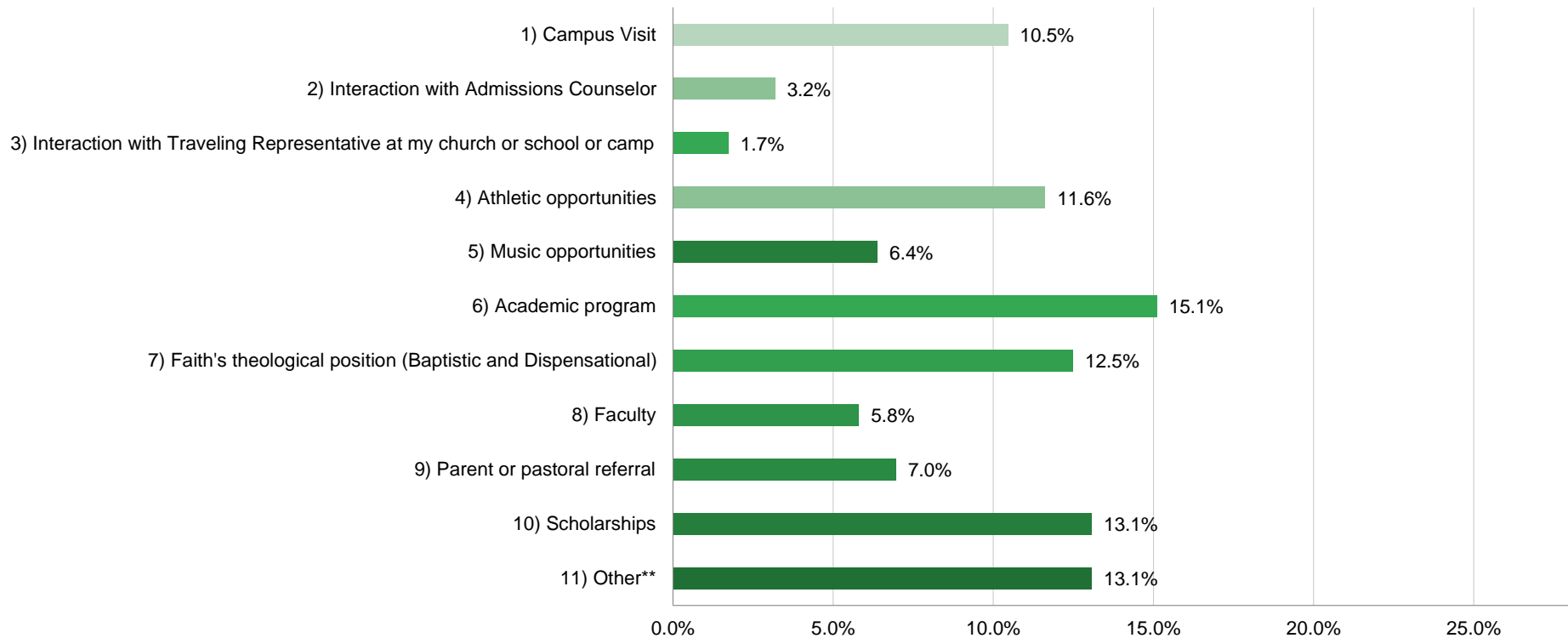

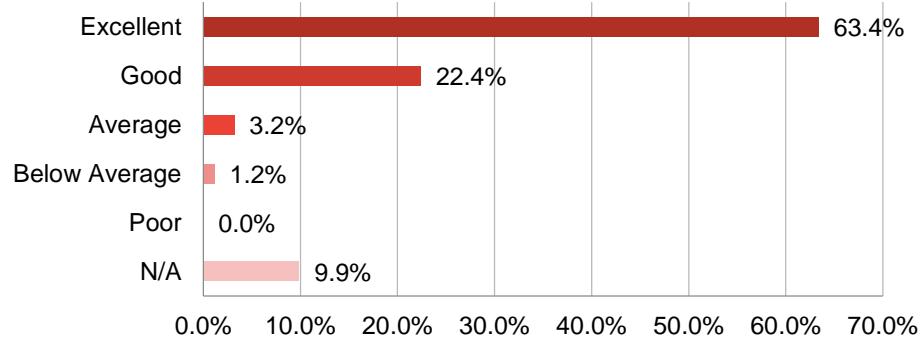
3) Knowledge and competence of staff

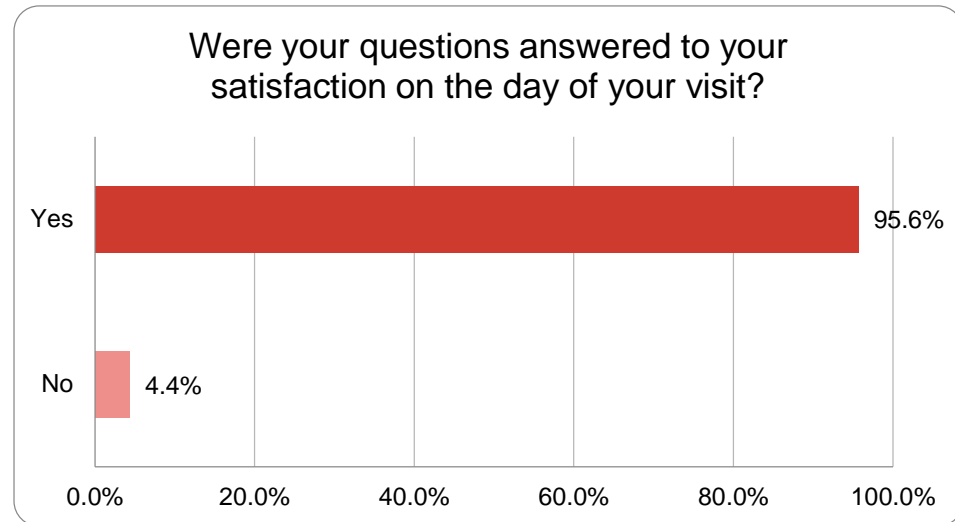


5) Overall experience with service provided by staff

Working with VA funding is a little bit of a hassle on the staff and student's end.

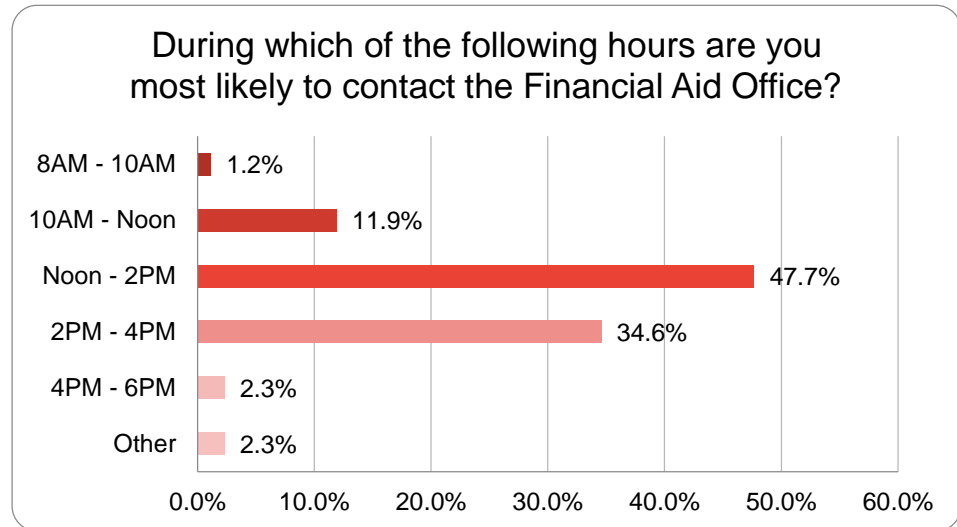

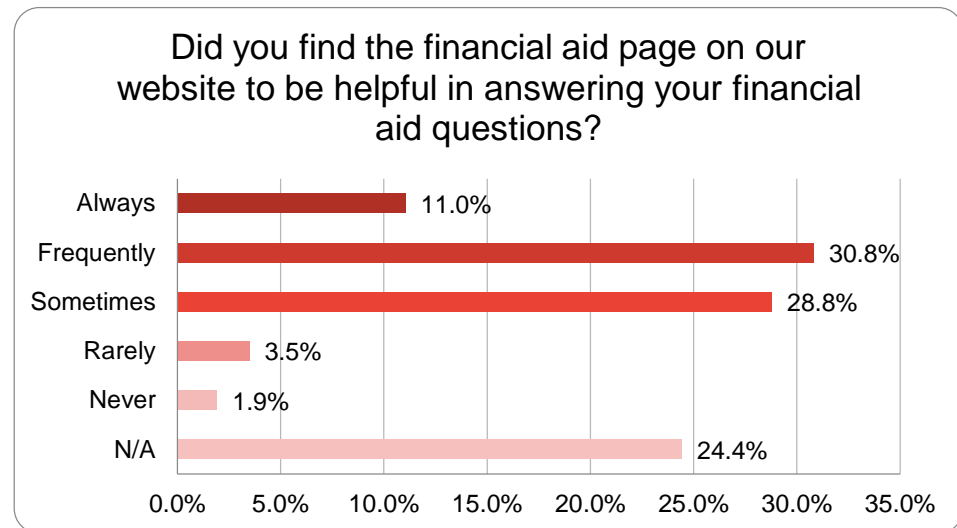

I literally got the email while driving to Faith saying that I going to be given \$1,500. I was under the understanding that I was going to receive \$3,500 when i committed to Faith. If feel as I had been baited into coming again, when offered a large amount and the given a small amount. I probably wouldn't have come again for my second year had I known about about the \$1,500. Also there is no scholarships for kids of laymens in the church. It's all for pastors and missionaries.

The staff members are very nice so I don't have a problem or challenges

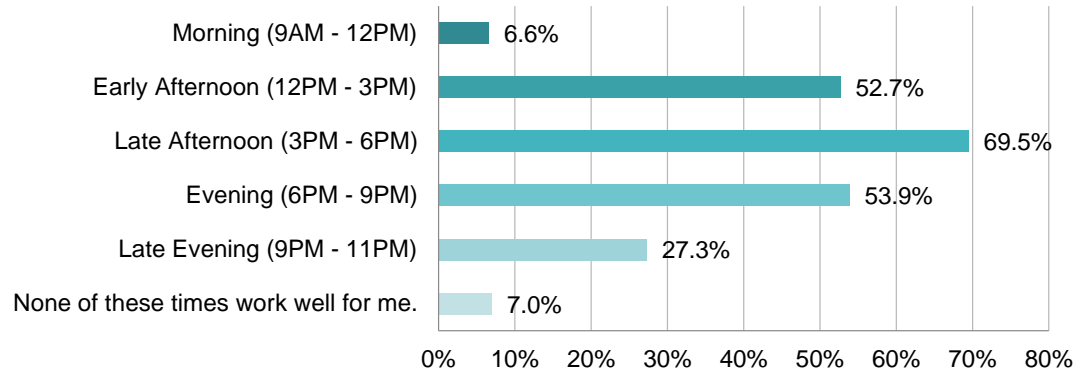

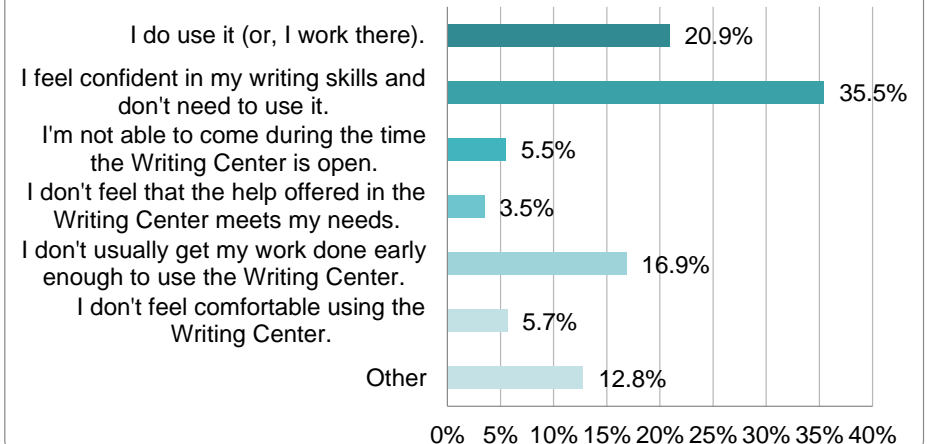
What Writing Center times would (generally) work best for you?

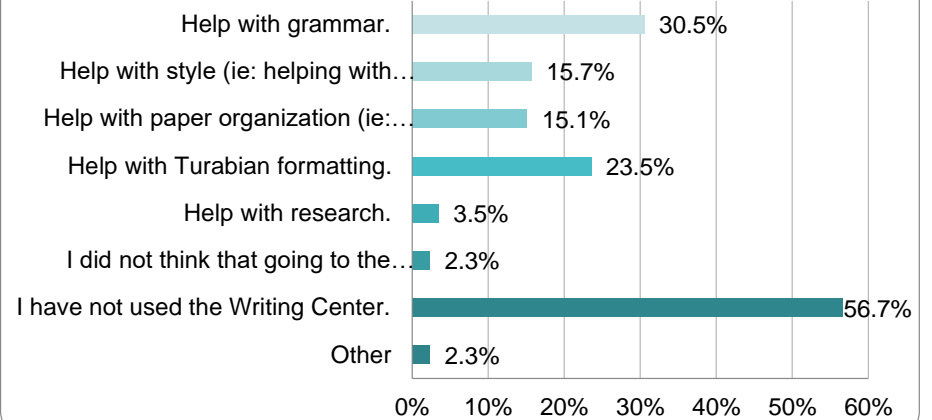

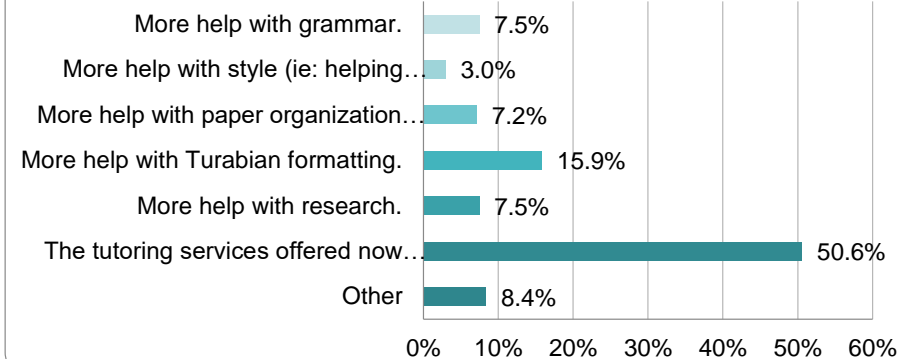
If you have used the Writing Center, what tutoring services have you found to be the most helpful?

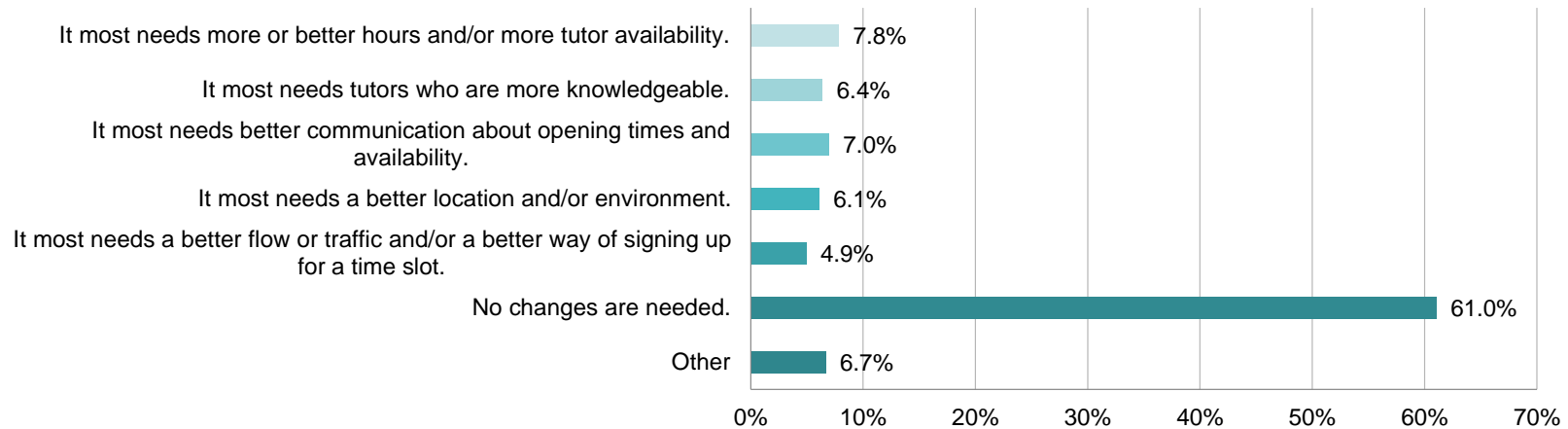

I probably would have gone more if I felt like I knew what to do if I went. I wasn't sure how the process worked, and I didn't need a ton of help with my paper so I haven't gone.

Maybe be more aware of what certain professors would want for a paper. The worst grade I have ever gotten was on a paper I gave to the write spot. I learned my weaknesses for sure, but big changes that were made to my paper were the exact things I got points taken off for. Though I do go to one guy outside of the write spot that works there and he does phenomenal on correcting my work.

Making the hours and how to utilize the Writing Center more available would be helpful.

It could use clearer instructions on how to do a Zoom meeting and where to find the Zoom link.

Nothing in particular needs to change. Having the option to sign up for a time slot would be really nice, but open availability is really nice so you can just show up. But, that is part of the problem, if I don't have time to wait and someone is there then I will have to leave with no help.

Writer Spot Tutors should have clear communication in the standard formatting for each professor's preferences since they all vary in their expectations. The professors should write out a listing of what they are looking for so the tutors have it written down to consult when helping a student write a paper for that specific professor.

The location is tough, because noise carries SO bad down the library. The write spot is a spot that isn't utilized enough, but it also just doesn't cater towards what I would need. I need the write spot to help me make 100% grade papers, and I need help with what I have and help with suggestions of where I'm wrong. Sometimes a specific hour cannot be covered, and I completely understand, but I think it would be helpful if there was something posted up at the WriteSpot when that is that case.

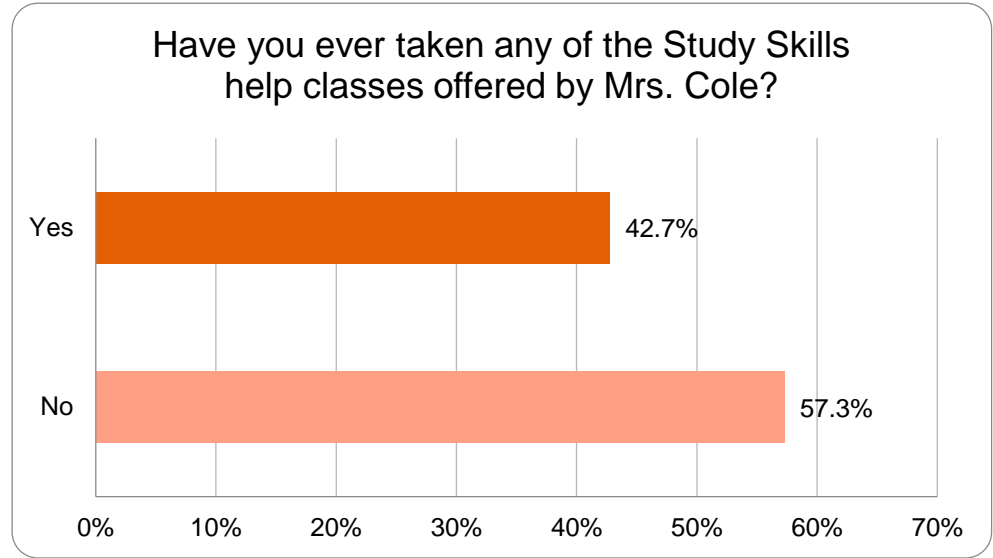

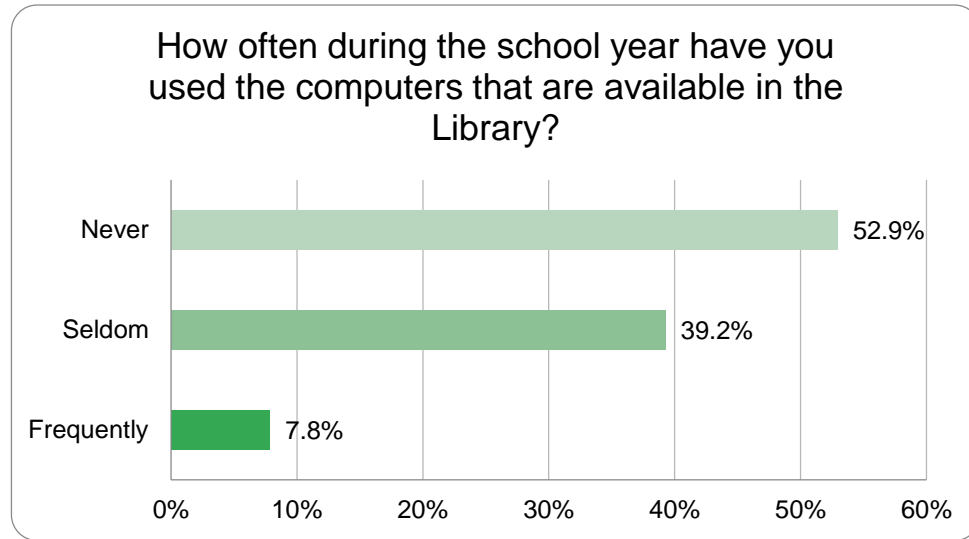

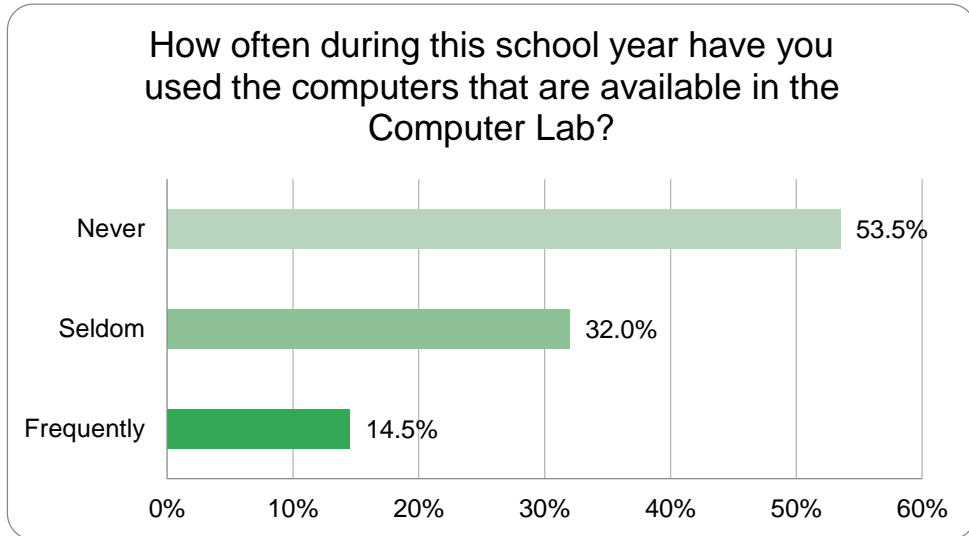
How often during the school year have you used the computers that are available in the Library? (computers other than those that host the online catalog)

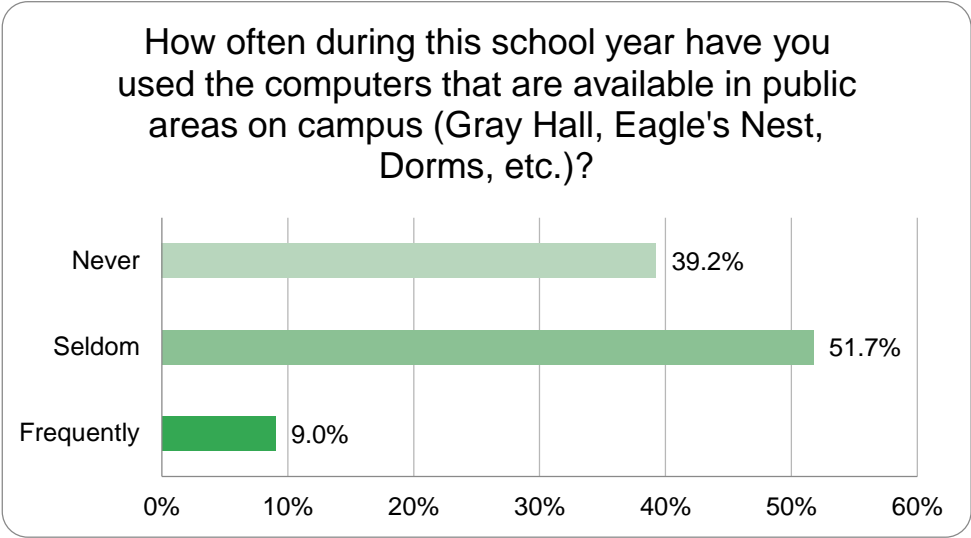
How often during this school year have you used the computers that are available in the Computer Lab?

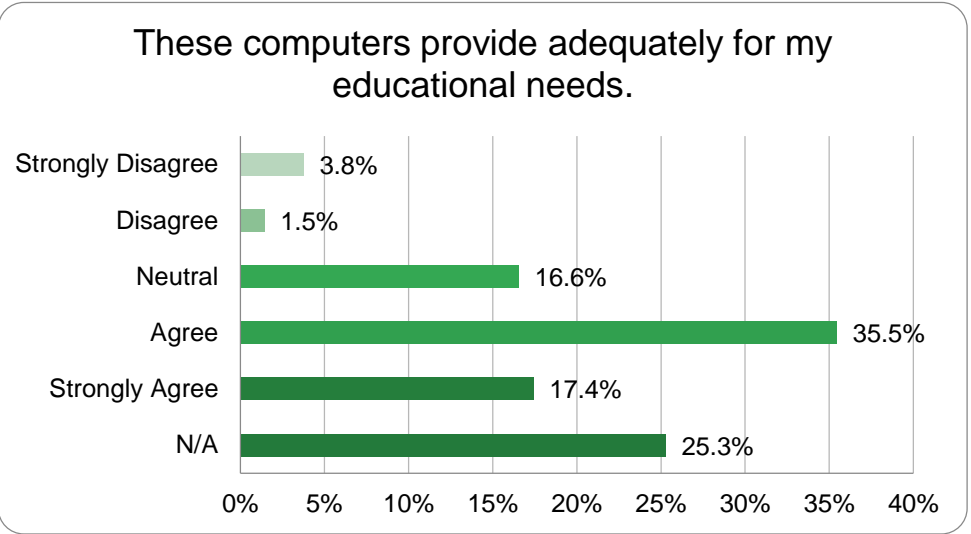
How often during this school year have you used the computers that are available in public areas on campus (Gray Hall, Eagle's Nest, Dorms, etc.)?

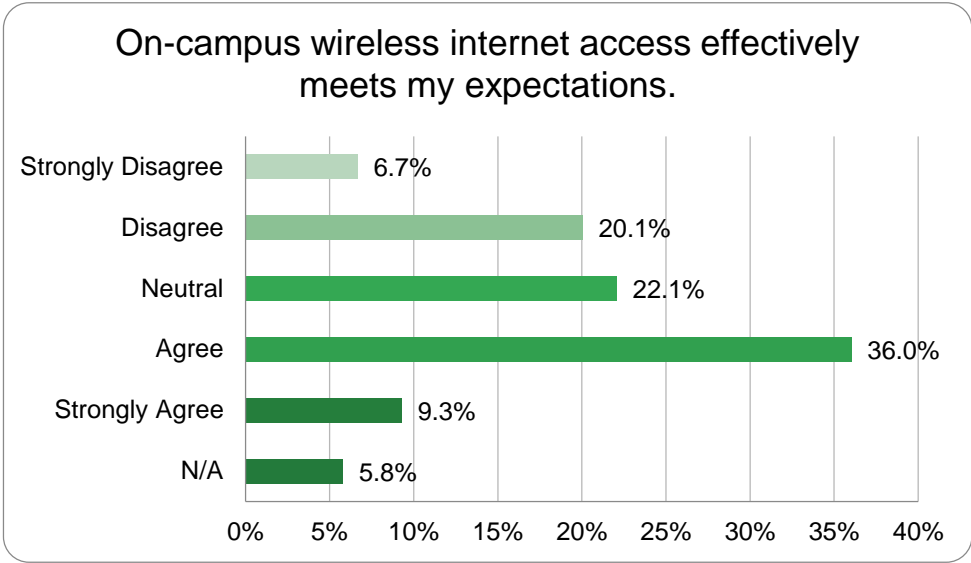

The internet does not work very well in the girls apartments.

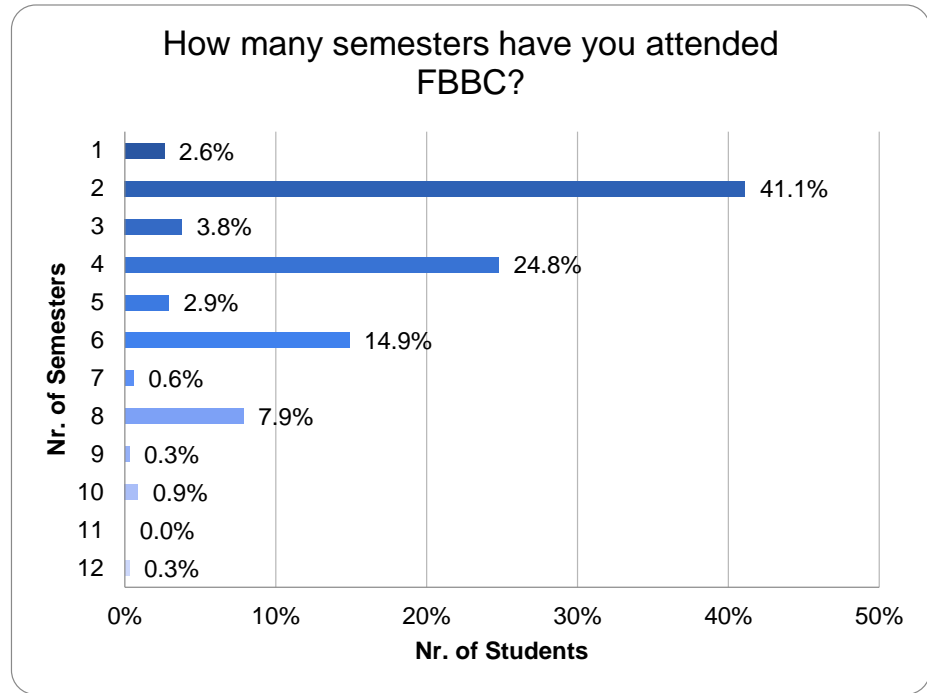

Executive Summary

Assessment Day 2025 took place on April 8, 2025. It was once again administered completely online such as we have been doing since we were forced to do so in 2020.

Until 2021 the FBBC Student Satisfaction Survey (SSI) was administered by means of a Scantron form which the students filled out while sitting in one of the classrooms. To be able to administer the survey in an online format the Administrative Assistant to the Vice President of Academic Affairs took the time to create the survey in Google Forms. She carried over the questions from previous administrations, but she did reorganize the order in which some of the questions were asked. The questions that appeared in the first section of the previous survey form she grouped into categories which makes it easier for data distribution to the various departments after the survey has been given. The students took the survey again this year on their computers while in their dorms or the library.

On Assessment Day 2025 all on-campus students taking more than six credit hours of classes were able to access the link to the FBBC Student Satisfaction Survey through a "class" that was created for them in our LMS, Canvas, specifically for the Assessment Day activities. 344 students filled out the survey. That was a 95% participation rate.

Because we administered the survey through Google Forms it was possible to have only students in their first year of school fill out the questions in the Admissions section. The decision to do this was made in consultation with the Admissions department. Since a number of procedural and personnel changes have been made since previous administrations, the feeling was that limiting the responses to those who had experienced the recent changes would give better and clearer feedback to the Admissions department of how the current procedure is perceived by the students. All other questions were answered by all the students.

Each department addressed in the 2025 FBBC SSI has been sent a copy of the data that pertains to their particular area. Along with the data the link to a survey was sent to encourage each department to take the time to read, digest and evaluate the data given. In the survey they were asked to name at least two positive areas from the data and how to champion that information. They were also asked to find at least two areas of concern that needed improvement and what action steps to take to make those improvements. The results of that work are given in the document named "2025 FBBC Student Satisfaction Survey Data Evaluation".

Another document has been prepared entitled "FBBC Student Satisfaction Survey Results 2017-2025" which shows the comparison data for the last five administrations of the FBBC Student Satisfaction Survey from the years 2017, 2019, 2021, 2023 and 2025. In it the percentages are compared and trends can be seen.
