WELCOME

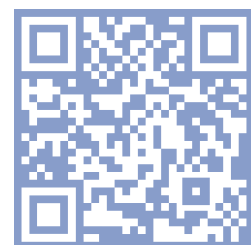

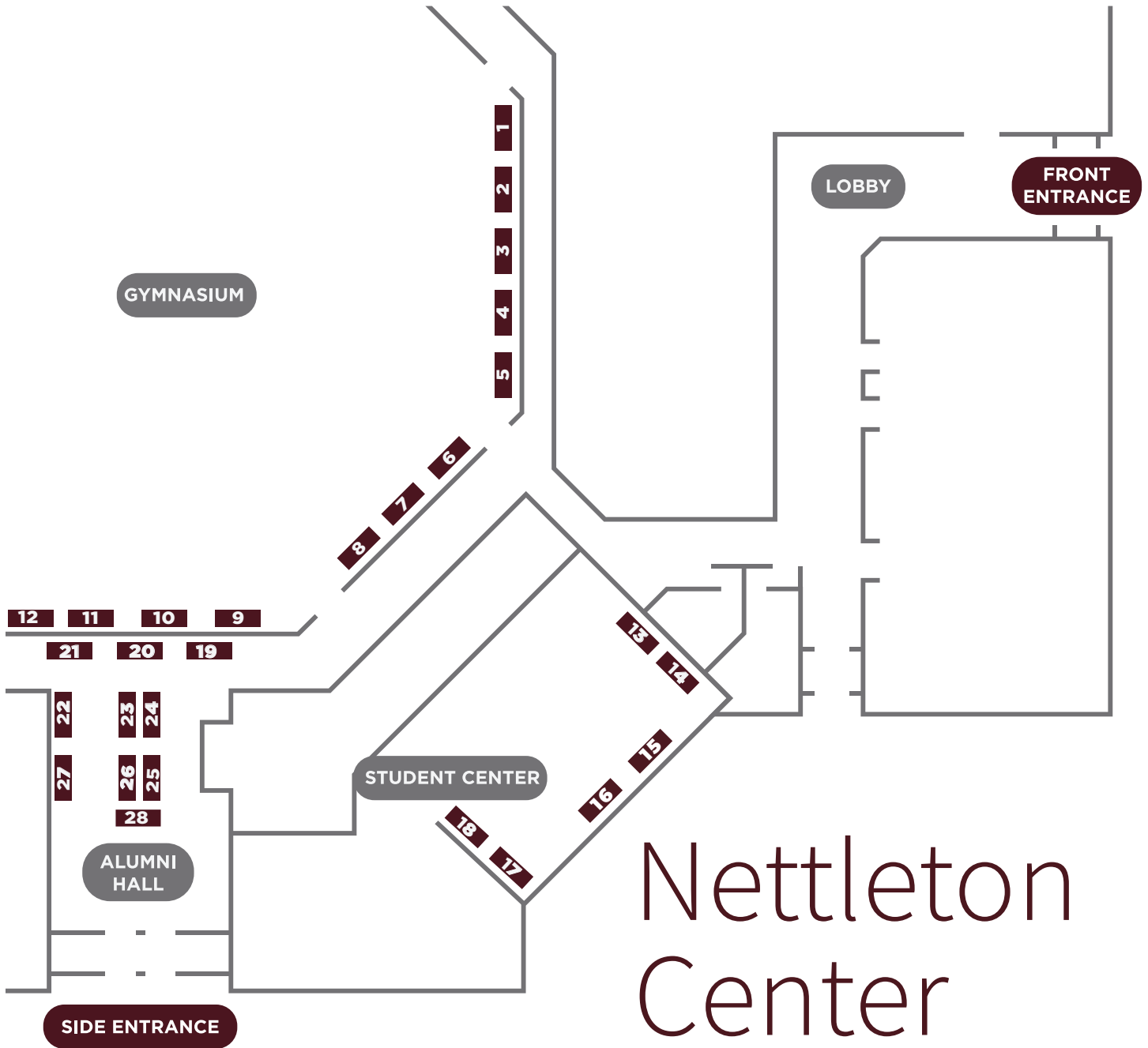

Ole Hallesby explains perceptively, *The thing to remember is that our carnal nature. . . will not refuse directly to participate with us in prayer. If this were the case, our warfare against our flesh would be comparatively simple. On the contrary, the protest of the carnal mind against prayer is made indirectly, very cleverly and at the opportune time. Instinctively and automatically it will mobilize all the reasons it can conceive of for not praying now: "You are too busy; your mind is too preoccupied; your heart is not inclined toward prayer; later on you will have more time, your mind will be more calm and collected, and you will be able to pray in a more devotional frame of mind."*

*Finally you decide to pray, but all of a sudden the thought comes; "I must do this thing first. When I have finished this, I shall be ready for a good season of prayer." Then you do the thing you have in mind. And when you have done it, your mind has become distracted. One thing after another begins to clamor for your attention. And before you know it, the whole day is gone, and you have not had a single quiet hour with God.*²

I pray not as I should, with faith, fervency, constancy, and feeling. I faint, and am discouraged in my journey. Hear me; thou seest a man go under a great burden, and perhaps so sinking under the same, that he must stoop and rest him often; and yet thou pitiest him, and thinkest for all this that he does carry his burden, though he resteth himself. So may it be with thee in prayer, seeing it is one of the hardest tasks in the world to pray with faith and feeling. If in this thou findest stops and failings, be not discouraged; thou seest what a hard thing it is [to] go upright under so great a burden. Yet be not out of heart, though thou must sit down by the way; but know that thy striving and endeavour shall bring thee through at the last. -Richard Sibbes³
